Poland Under Feminist Eyes is a one-day workshop on the reception and application of feminist ideas and methodologies to the field of Polish Studies, mainly to literary and cultural studies (drama and film), but also including a presentation by a Polish anthropologist.

The Polish Workshop 2008 is organized by Dr Ursula Phillips (School of Slavonic and East European Studies, UCL, London) and Dr Urszula Chowaniec (University of Tampere, Finland).



Who Can Participate?

The approach of the workshop will be practical and aimed at postgraduate students as well as fellow researchers including those from other disciplines from the wider UCL and from other universities. The workshop aims at making notions and theories as accessible as possible, with an emphasis on showing how feminist ideas may be applied in practice (e.g. in analysing a film or interpreting a literary text).
